

Spring is right around the corner and to help dust-out winter's cob-webs we are bringing you a 30-day spring-cleaning challenge. Each task will take approximately one hour to finish.

We start in the KITCHEN on day #1. Clean the microwave and oven.

Tip: Ammonia should not be used to clean a Wolf oven cavity, racks, or rack guides. Any suggestions to clean an oven by sitting ammonia in the oven overnight should be avoided with Wolf products. Ammonia is not FDA approved for this use, and Wolf does not recommend it. Refer to the Wolf Cleaning Guide for further information on proper cleaning of a Wolf oven.

On day #2 we are still in the KITCHEN. Clean the dishwasher and small appliances.

FisherPaykel recommends using a cleaner like Lemi shine machine cleaner or Finish dishwasher cleaner-following instructions from the manufacturer. You may also place a bit of vinegar in a cup and place the cup on a basket inside the dishwasher. Run the dishwasher on the heavy cycle if using vinegar.

On day #3, still in the KITCHEN and it's time to wipe down the pantry.

<u>Ayr Custom Cabinetry</u> recommends cleaning off any heavy or sticky residues with a warm, mild solution of Murphy's Oil Soap or equivalent. Touch up scratches with Old English Scratch Cover or a paste wax shoe polish. Dry with soft clean cloth immediately.

We are in the KITCHEN on day #4. Scrub down the fridge.

To clean Sub-Zero refrigerator interior shelves and the light diffuser, follow these steps:

- Remove shelves, drawers and light diffuser from unit.
- To remove or adjust a glass shelf, tilt up, and then lift up and out.
- Allow shelves, drawers and light diffuser to warm to room temperature.
- CAUTION: Failing to allow shelves or diffusers to warm to room temperature before submerging
  in water can cause the shelf or diffuser to shatter, damaging the part and possible injury.
- Using mild detergent, a little baking soda and water, wipe with a soft cloth.
- Rinse and dry shelving thoroughly before installing.
- For stains or debris that are difficult to remove:
- Allow the shelf or diffuser to soak in a bath tub filled with warm water and 1/10 bleach mixture over night.
- Use a toothbrush or can of compressed air to remove any remaining residue.
- Using a handheld steam cleaner with spray nozzle may also reach stubborn spots.

We are still in the KITCHEN on day #5. Organize and toss expired foods.

In the KITCHEN again on day #6. Clean kitchen sink and under the sink.

To clean a stainless steel sink use an ordinary mild detergent and soft cloth, rinse and towel dry. Steel soap pads should never be used; particles can adhere to a stainless steel sink surface and will eventually rust.

For all other sink finishes, please refer to the manufacturer's recommendations.

In the KITCHEN again on day #7. Wipe down walls and wash garbage can.

Please refer to tile manufacturer's instructions before cleaning any tile. Also refer to the <u>Benjamin</u> Moore website before washing down your walls.

Ayr Custom Cabinetry recommends cleaning off any heavy or sticky residues with a warm, mild solution of Murphy's Oil Soap or equivalent. Touch up scratches with Old English Scratch Cover or a paste wax shoe polish. Dry with soft clean cloth immediately

We are in the KITCHEN on day #8. Clean the stove top, kitchen surface areas and floor.

Instructions for cleaning a Wolf Gas Cooktop, Stainless Steel Riser or Backsplash. To remove burn marks or heat stains, apply Penny Brite® cleaning paste to a sponge and lightly rub with the grain until burn marks are gone. Wipe any remaining residue with a clean, damp cloth or sponge. Apply a polish to maintain luster and protect the surface from future stains. We are in the BATHROOM on day #9. Clean the medicine cabinets and storage.

In the BATHROOM on day #11. Clean the showers, tubs, shower doors and walls.

To clean your Kohler Acrylic Bath/Whirlpool

- Wipe out bath/whirlpool after each use with soft cloth or squeegee.
- Do not use abrasive cleaners.
- Avoid using aerosol products on the bath surface.

## Care Tip

To restore dull or scratched units: Apply white automotive polishing compound with a clean cloth. Rub scratches and dull areas vigorously. Wipe off residue. Follow with a coat of white automotive paste wax. Do not wax areas where you walk or stand. Damaged surfaces can be repaired. Check the Yellow Pages under "Fiberglass-Repair."

### For Rust Removal

In the BATHROOM on day #12. Clean the toilet, bathroom surface areas, mirror and floor.

To clean a Kohler toilet.

- Soft abrasive cleaners may be used when necessary to clean KOHLER vitreous china products.

Marvin Windows and Doors provide these window cleaning tips.

For best results, do not clean glass when it is exposed to direct sunlight.

- 1. Start cleaning glass at the top of the building and continue to lower levels.
- 2. Soak the glass surface with a clean water and soap solution to loosen dirt and debris.
- 3. Use a mild, non abrasive window washing solution and apply with a non abrasive applicator.
- 4. Immediately after washing the glass, remove all of the cleaning solution with a squeegee, taking care not to allow any metal surface of the cleaning equipment to touch the glass surface.
- 5. Dry all cleaning solution from window gaskets, sealants and frames. Also, make sure that no abrasive particles are trapped between the glass and the cleaning material. Window and door gasket, sealants and frames are susceptible to deterioration if the water and cleaning solutions are not dried away immediately after cleaning.

Use of razor blades or knifes is not recommended on any coated glass such as Low E II. WARNING: Do not use scrapers for cleaning glass. Glass scratched by a scraper is not covered under the Marvin Window and Door warranty.

To get the most out of your vacuuming regime, remember these few easy tips:

- A guick once-over doesn't do much. Slow and steady does the trick.
- When vacuuming, don't ignore those corners and crevices where dust builds.
- "Top-down" cleaning saves you the step of vacuuming again after dusting. Dust blinds, windowsills, and furniture surfaces first and then vacuum away any fallen dust.
- Remember to replace or empty vacuum bags when they are half to two-thirds full.

## How Often Should You Vacuum?

As a rule of thumb, you should vacuum at least once a week with a quality vacuum cleaner. However, the more foot traffic over your carpet, the more you need to vacuum. The general formula is:

- Vacuum daily in high-traffic or pet areas.
- Vacuum twice weekly in medium-traffic areas.
- Vacuum weekly in light-traffic areas, using attachments at carpet edges.

With today's advances in wood flooring stains and finishes, cleaning your wood floors has never been easier. Regular maintenance requires little more than sweeping with a soft bristle broom, and vacuuming with a soft floor attachment if your wood floor includes a beveled edge that could collect debris. You also should clean your floors periodically with a professional wood floor cleaning product recommended by a wood flooring professional. There are other steps you can take to minimize maintenance and maintain the beauty of your wood floors as well. Hinkley Lighting states: Initial care for finishes requires only periodic cleaning with a soft cloth, dampened with water. A mild non-abrasive soap may be used along with a soft cloth and water if the fixture is very dirty. Particular care should be taken to avoid abrasive materials and strong cleaning agents as they will quickly destroy the protective coatings and subject the finish to rapid oxidation and discoloration.

## Gas Fireplaces:

- Clean glass, surrounds & decorative fronts
- Change batteries in remote controls
- Inspect venting
- Oil door hinges
- Schedule annual inspection by qualified service technician

# Woodburning Fireplaces:

- If your fireplace does not have an ash pit or box, shovel the bulk of the ashes into a bag and vacuum the remaining lightweight ashes.
- Gently scrub the walls of the firebox opening with a stiff-bristle brush (not a wire brush) only to the height of the lintel (the heavy steel brace that supports the masonry above the fireplace opening).
- Be gentle with firebrick because it crumbles easily. Be careful not to bend any edges on a metal firebox where it joins the flue. Bent edges leave openings to the wall stud or supports where fire could spread.
- Schedule the chimney to be professionally cleaned.

Refer to your fireplace operation manual prior to cleaning.

For general cleaning of both the frame and screen of your Plasma TV, use a soft, clean, lint free, dry cloth. Most televisions come with a microfiber cloth that you can use for this purpose. Never use cleaning fluids, wax, or chemicals except as described below. Do not use water unless the instructions that came with your TV say otherwise, and only use water on the portion of the TV that the instructions say to use it on.

Never use any type of window cleaner, soap, scouring powder, or any cleanser with solvents such as alcohol, benzene, ammonia, or paint thinner. Never use abrasive pads or paper towels. If you do, you can scratch the screen or strip the anti-glare coating off the screen and cause permanent damage.

- If it's a painted enamel surface, you can use a regular liquid household cleaning agent.
- Hand-rubbed finishes, stained-wood or natural finishes require special care using a product that will not dull, discolor or stain the surface. The type of wood is not important, except when color is a consideration.
- Genuine wood and synthetics can be cleaned the same way, as long as there's a protective coating of varnish or another sealant.
- With uncoated raw wood, such as some cedar paneling, cleaning can be risky.

To clean a Whirlpool Duet Washer:

# Cleaning the Inside of the Washer

This washer has a special cycle that uses higher water volumes in combination with affresh® Washer Cleaner or liquid chlorine bleach to thoroughly clean the inside of the washer. Steam washer models also utilize steam to enhance cleaning in this special cycle. NOTE: <u>Read these instructions completely before beginning the cleaning process</u>.

# Begin procedure

- 1. affresh® Washer Cleaner Cycle Procedure (Recommended for Best Performance):
  - a. Open the washer door and remove any clothing or items.
  - b. Add an affresh® Washer Cleaner tablet to the washer drum.
  - c. Do not add the affresh® Washer Cleaner tablet to the dispenser drawer.
  - d. Do not add any detergent or other chemical to the washer when following this procedure.
  - e. Close the washer door.
  - f. Select the CLEAN WASHER cycle.
  - g. Touch and hold START to begin the cycle. The Clean Washer Cycle Operation is described below.
- 2. Chlorine Bleach Procedure:
  - a. Open the washer door and remove any clothing or items.
  - b. Open the dispenser drawer and add liquid chlorine bleach to the MAX level in both the bleach compartment and the fabric softener compartment. NOTE: Use of more liquid chlorine bleach than is recommended above could cause washer damage over time.
  - c. Close the washer door and the dispenser drawer.
  - d. Do not add any detergent or other chemicals to the washer when following this procedure.
  - e. Close the washer door.
  - f. Select the CLEAN WASHER cycle.
  - g. Touch and hold START to begin the cycle. The Clean Washer Cycle Operation is described below. NOTE: For best results, do not interrupt cycle.

## **Description of Clean Washer Cycle Operation:**

- 1. The Clean Washer cycle will determine whether clothing or other items are in the washer.
- 2. If no items are detected in the washer, it will proceed with the cycle
  - A If any items are detected in the washer, "RL" (remove load) will be displayed. The door will unlock. Open washer and remove any garments from the washer drum.
  - b. Touch POWER to clear the "RL" code.
  - c. Touch and hold START to restart the cycle. After the cycle is complete, leave the door open slightly to allow for better ventilation and drying of the washer interior.

We're on the PATIO/DECK on Day #29 of our Spring Clean Challenge & it's time to clean the outdoor equipment.

<u>Wolf</u> recommends the following care procedures for a stainless steel grill. For full cleaning recommendations, please visit the website.

#### STAINLESS STEEL EXTERIOR

Outdoor grills, modules and grill carts.

- Never clean the stainless steel exterior when it is hot. After the initial grilling, certain areas of the
  outdoor product may discolor. This is a normal discoloration caused by the intense heat given off
  by the burners.
- After the grill has cooled, use a mild abrasive pad such as Scotch Brite with a mild stainless steel cleaner to scrub the stainless steel parts of your grill. Always scrub in the direction of the grain.
- Specks of grease can gather on the surface of the stainless steel and get baked-on. These can
  be removed by using a mild abrasive pad with a stainless steel cleaner. Do not use steel wool to
  clean stainless steel.

We're on Day #30 of our Spring Clean Challenge & it's time to clean the vacuum and restock cleaning supplies.

Congratulations on completing the 30-day challenge. If you have a central vacuum system, empty the dirt canister and refer to the owner's manual for other maintenance items. If you own a regular vacuum, consider taking it in for servicing.
